



TAFT SCHOOL WATERTOWN, CONN.



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Sweat socks gave way to Shakespeare when the Taft School's two outgrown gymnasiums were converted to a 42,000-square-foot arts and humanities complex at a cost of \$100 a square foot. The judges cited the well-crafted lobbies and gallery spaces inserted behind the structure's new facade. Bay windows and skylights bring light inside. An octagonal tower and gables add sparkle to the exterior, blending the new complex with the surrounding Gothic-style buildings to complete a "dramatic backdrop" around the school's lake shore.
